

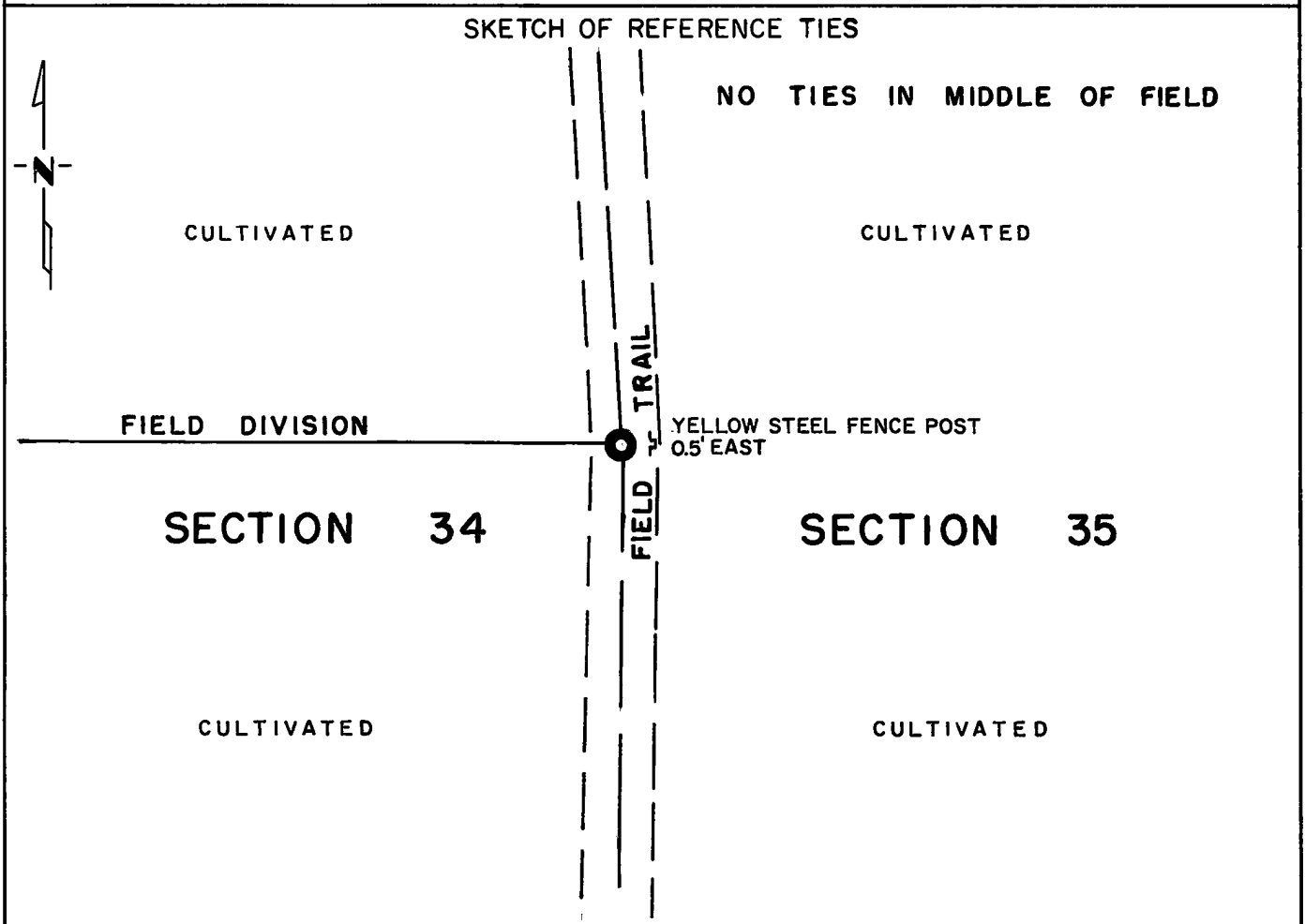
CERTIFICATE OF LOCATION OF GOVERNMENT CORNER

Statement of Evidence: EAST QUARTER CORNER SECTION 34, T114N, R40W

The original Public Land Survey was run in 1864 and a wood post was set in a mound with pits to mark the corner.

In 1916 John Norgaard, County Surveyor, found a stone that he had set when the original mound was still visible.

On October 18, 1971, the Minnesota Highway Department excavated and found a 6" x 6" x 8" field stone down 2' at the centerline of field road north-south and on field division west.

An analysis of the record data dating to original corner, and interviews with area Farmers, Lester Arnesen and Lowell Helle, provides a continuous chain of perpetuation of the original Public Land Survey corner.
