Statement of Evidence: NORTH QUARTER CORNER SECTION 10, T115N, R39W, 5TH P.M.

The original Public Land Survey was completed in 1864 by Charles E. Davis and J. W. Webb Jr. A wood post was set in a monument of rocks with pits to mark the corner.

Jonah Peterman, County Surveyor, shows on a survey in Dec. 1883 that the quarter post had probably been destroyed. He did not need this corner for that particular survey and he did not need this corner for that particular survey and he apparently did not set any kind of monument for the corner.

The Minnesota Highway Department cast iron monument was placed in 1968 by Arbie E. Nelson, a private Land Surveyor, at a point equi-distant between section corners.

Said cast iron monument is within 0.3 feet of being equi-distant between section corners and within 3.5 feet of being on line between section corners. There are no occupation lines that can be seen from the cast iron monument.

This close agreement of the cast iron monument's position compared to the lost location provides an acceptable location for the quarter-corner.
