The original Public Land Survey was run in 1867 and a post set in a mound with charred stakes and pits to mark the original corner.

In 1901, J. Norgaard, County Surveyor, placed a 6"x6"x24" Jasper stone monument at the stake in the government mound.

In 1929, Minnesota Highway Department field notes indicate finding a 6"x6"x24" Jasper stone monument.

In 1930, D. F. Mattson, Minnesota Highway Department Project Engineer, found the 6"x6"x24" Jasper stone monument and placed two reference ties.

In 1934, the County Engineer found a 6"x6"x24" Jasper stone monument and two reference ties and placed two more reference ties.

On December 16, 1976, the Minnesota Highway Department placed a cast iron monument using information and ties from right-of-way map and final grading plans. Top of monument is down 1" below surface.

An analysis of the record data indicates the cast iron monument set by the Minnesota Department of Transportation is accepted as the location of the Public Land Survey corner.

The jasper stone was removed during road construction in 1965. The corner was re-established from 1929 survey data and perpetuates the location of the original Public Land Survey corner.
