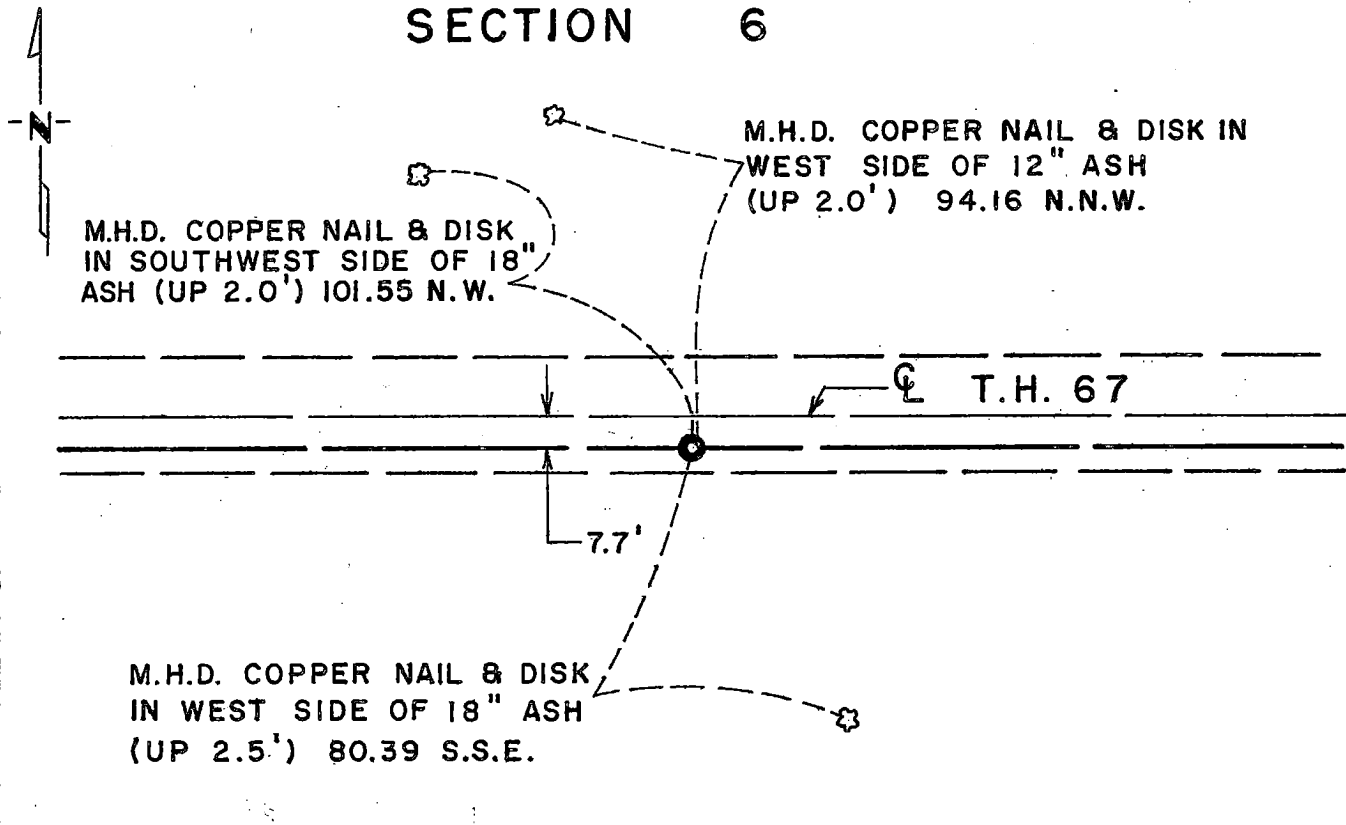

Statement of Evidence: North 1/4 Cor., Sec. 7, Township 115N, Range 43W

The original Public Land Survey was run in 1867 and a post set in a mound with pits to mark the original corner.

In 1890, J. Peterman found a stone in mound. (Surv. Rec. Pg. 71)

In 1929, Minnesota Highway Department field notes show a 6"x6" stone post 1½" below surface.

In 1930, D. F. Mattson, Minnesota Highway Department Project Engineer, found 3/4"x12" I.P. (Cert. Loc. #91261).

On December 16, 1976, the Minnesota Highway Department placed a cast iron monument using information and ties from the right-of-way map and final grading plans. Top of monument is down 1" below surface.

An analysis of the record data indicates the cast iron monument set by the Minnesota Department of Transportation is accepted as the location of the Public Land Survey corner.

The stone monument found in 1929 was removed by road construction in 1965. The corner was re-established from data shown on a 1930 R/W map and perpetuates the location of the corner as marked by the 1929 stone.
