



Statement of Evidence: Northeast Cor., Sec. 7, Township 115N, Range 42W

The original Public Land Survey was run in 1864 and a post set in a mound with pits to mark the original corner.

In May 1891, J. Peterman, County Surveyor, found a stone.

In 1901, John Norgaard, County Surveyor, found a stone at intersection of roads North, South, East and West and placed a 6"x6"x24" Jasper Stone Monument.

In April 1930, D. F. Mattson, Project Engineer for the Minnesota Highway Department, found the Jasper Stone monument and made ties.

In 1934, the County Highway Engineer found the monument and checked ties.

On June 30, 1976, the Minnesota Highway Department dug for the monument but did not find it.

On July 13, 1976, the Minnesota Highway Department set a cast iron monument using information and ties from the right-of-way map and final grading plans. Top of monument is down 2" below surface.

An analysis of the record data indicates the cast iron monument set by the Minnesota Department of Transportation is accepted as the location of the Public Land Survey corner.
