## Statement of Evidence:

Southeast Corner of Section 33, Township 114, Range 46. Yellow Medicine County.

This corner was found to be in a lake by the U.S. General Land Office survey in 1871. The government notes show meander corners set 22.50 chains east and 5.40 chains west.

In 1957 and 1977, the DNR Bureau of Engineering contacted the Yellow Medicine County Offices of the Recorder and Highway Engineer for corner information. The following information was obtained from the Recorder:

In 1899 to 1901, John Norgaard, County Surveyor, remonumented all section corners in the county and recorded his work in Surveyor's Record Book B. On page 200 he states he located his corner at equal distance between quarter corners and on line between the South Quarter corner Section 34 and the meander corner on the south line Section 33. He set a 6" x 6" x 24" jasper granite monument 4" above ground.

On June 30, 1977, we found a 7"  $\times$  7"  $\times$  24" granite block leaning over. We straightened the block and set a 3/4"  $\times$  24" iron rod on the west side flush with the ground. This area is normally under water. We also found a 1/2"  $\times$  26" iron pipe 7.8' easterly of the monument as set by this office in 1962.
