## STATEMENT OF EVIDENCE

## North Quarter Corner Section 4, T114N-R45W

Oct. 1858

W.J. Neely was contracted by the United States Government Land Office to perform the Original Public Land Survey in this township. He records in his field notes, "Set cor sec post deposited coal made mound Trench \$ pits as per instructions."

June 6, 1883

Jonah Peterman, County Surveyor, Records in County Surveyor's Record Book, pg 15 notes a "Stone".

May 16, 1899

John Norgaard entered into a contract with the Yellow Medicine County Board for the "re-survey of all the section corners except the Township corners" in Yellow Medicine County. "The Monuments are Jasper Granite 2 feet long by 6" by 6", all dimensions are given in feet." John Norgaard turned in his survey field notes to the Yellow Medicine County Recorder, who filed them as Doc No. 28417, on September 28, 1901. These field notes became the County Surveyor's Record Book B page 41.

Sept. 3, 1934

John Norgaard, County Surveyor, records in the County Surveyor's Record Book, pg 542, a distance from the NE corner of this Section to the west line of the East  $\frac{1}{2}$  of the NE  $\frac{1}{4}$ , but does not mention if he found a monument at the N $\frac{1}{4}$  position.

1935

MnDOT SP8709 T.H. 68 Book 4, Page 6, Alignments - Land Ties-Topo, shows the  $1/16^{th}$  corner to the west of this corner position.

1947

MnDOT SP8708 T.H. 68 Book 4, Page 2-10, Alignments - Land Ties, shows the NE corner and the NW corner but does not show any dimensions or angles locating the N  $\frac{1}{4}$  corner.

Oct 13, 2011

John Madsen, R.L.S. 13593, while doing survey work in Section 4, shows he "Found a Iron rod in bit. paving (surface)."

Aug 2, 2012

Joshua M. Stern, Land Surveyor #46169, while doing a remonumentation survey for the Minnesota Department of Transportation located a  $\frac{1}{2}$ " capped rebar with LS 11943 at the surface. He dug a 6.3' deep hole that covered an area extending 5' north, 2.5' south, 3' east, 6' west of the  $\frac{1}{2}$ " capped iron rod location. At a depth of 0.4' a  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 16" rebar was found upright. At a depth of 5' he found the top of original top soil. Throughout the excavation He came across small field stones, but nothing that appeared to have been set by a surveyor. There is a drainage ditch located just to the south of the corner location, which may answer to the amount of mix and stones located above the original topsoil. A cast iron capped 2" square by 30" long iron telspar monument was placed at the surface at the position of the found  $\frac{1}{2}$ " LS 11943 capped rebar and the  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 16" capped rebar.
