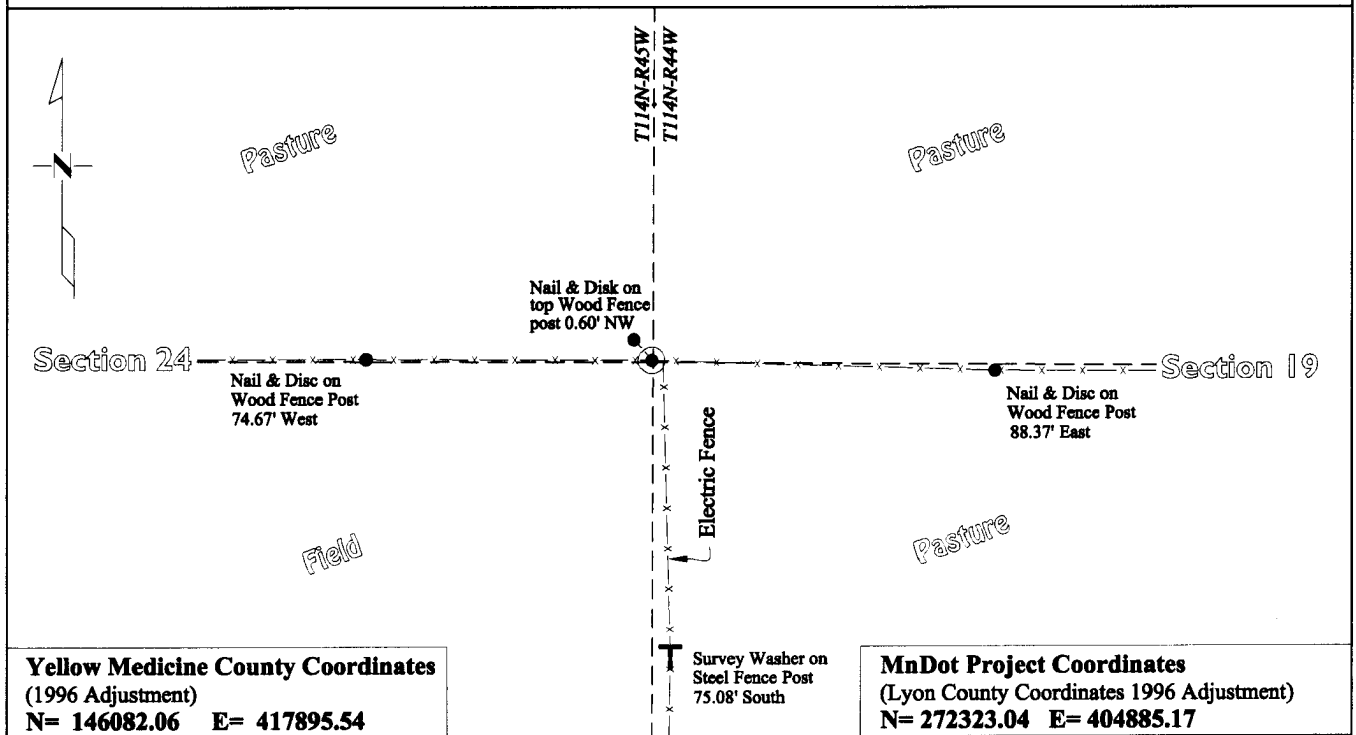

# **STATEMENT OF EVIDENCE**

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## **East Quarter Corner Section 24, T114N-R45W**

1858

W.J. Neely was contracted by the United States Government Land Office to perform the Original Public Land Survey in this township. He records in his field notes "Set cor sec post deposited coal made mound Trench & pits as per instruction".

December 6, 2012

Matthew D. Runke, LS 46171, while doing a re-monumentation survey for the Minnesota Department of Transportation, searched an area extending 6.0' north and 6.0' south, 10.0' east and 10.0' west of a straight split location with a metal locator and found nothing. This corner was not excavated due to the 154 year gap in survey activity, records and perpetuation of this corner position. The straight line and split location fits very well with fences running East, South and west of this corner position, and appears to be the best evidence of the location of this section corner. A Cast Iron capped 2"x30" Telspar Monument was placed midway and on line between the northeast and southeast corners of this section.
