THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION WAS COMPILED BY THE DNR ENGINEERING SECTION IN 1975:

Original corner was established and monumented by the General Land Office in 1858. Field notes describe monument as a post which is assumed to be a wood post. No evidence of the original corner or its accessories remain.

In May 1975, the DNR Engineering Section contacted the Yellow Medicine and Lac Qui Parle County Register of Deeds, Auditors, Engineers and the MHD.

Survey record data on page 111 in the Yellow Medicine County SURVEY BOOK "B" disclosed that said corner was found in place shortly before September 1901 by John Norgaard, County Surveyor. Said survey notes state:

Found iron monument located by me 2 years ago. Set top of monument level with ground.

The preface to SURVEY BOOK "B" dated September 1901 by John Norgaard, states that 6 inch by 6 inch by 24 inch jasper granite monuments were set at the section corners when Oshkosh Township was re-monumented.

A recorded survey plat in the Lac Qui Parle Register of Deeds office shows that Section 36-116-44 was surveyed in October 1901 by George Michel, Surveyor. Said survey describes the southwest corner as being marked by stone in road grade.

A recorded survey plat in the Yellow Medicine Register of Deeds Office shows that Section 1-115-44 was surveyed in April 1926 by John Norgaard, County Surveyor. The notes don't state what was found or used but two ties are given. Said survey has a distance of 5342 feet between section corners on the north line which differs from the 1901 survey by 98.5 feet. Both surveys claimed to have found the section corner stones.

Wilfred Miller, approximately 62 years old, who lived on the $E\frac{1}{2}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$ Section 1 from 1920 to 1957, said that he remembers the 1926 survey and that the section corner stone should be at the road intersection. He said the fence line west is south of the section line as there used to be a road going west years ago.

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Beauford Pearson, approximately 75 years old, lifetime area resident – grew up in the $NE\frac{1}{4}$ $NE\frac{1}{4}$ Section 2, said the corner stone should be at the road intersection. He said the fence line west is south of the section line as there used to be a road going west years ago.

Walter Bengtson, approximately 52 years old, 3 year owner of the $NE^{1/4}$ and longtime owner of the $SW^{1/4}$ Section 2, said that the section line would be north of his fence in line with the township road going east.

Harlan Thompson, approximately 52 years old, 18 year owner of the $SW^{1/4}$ Section 36, knew nothing about corners and had just assumed existing occupation lines as being correct.

April 30, a red colored Surveyor's Record Book, Page 500, obtained from Yellow Medicine County Recorder's Office, contains a survey in Section 1, by John Norgaard, County Surveyor. Survey shows corner but does not indicate what kind of monument was found or set. The following ties are shown to the corner:

telephone pole, northwest, 26 feet fence corner, southwest, 36.5 feet 2671 feet from the north quarter corner of Section 1 5342 feet from the northeast corner of Section 1

1975 May 27, the DNR Bureau of Engineering dug with a backhoe to dig for evidence of the corner. A 10 foot by 10 foot by 4 foot deep hole was dug and at a depth of 1 foot, a 1 foot by 1 foot by 0.8 of a foot pointed field stone was found. The bottom of the hole was below natural ground. The field stone was removed and a railroad spike was set in its place and the following ties were taken to it:

4 feet south of the centerline of a road east
15 feet north of a crooked steel fence post fence line west
4 feet east of the centerline of a north-south road
nail and bottle cap on southeast side of power pole, southwest, 44.76 feet
filed "V" in west end of CMC, southwest, 42.00 feet
filed "V" in east end of CMC, southeast 38.17 feet
2657.50 feet from the north quarter corner of Section 1

- April 22, the DNR Bureau of Engineering found the railroad spike at the corner and replaced it with a ¾ inch diameter by 3.3 foot long iron pipe, down 0.3 of a foot.
- August 25, the DNR Division of Lands and Minerals visited the area of the corner and found a ³/₄ inch diameter iron pipe, down 0.3 of a foot. The iron pipe was found to be:

4 feet south of the centerline of a road east

15 feet north of a crooked steel fence post fence line west

4 feet east of the centerline of a north-south road

2657.45 feet from the north quarter corner of Section 1

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Analysis of the above information led the DNR Division of Lands and Minerals to conclude that the found ¾ inch diameter iron pipe which was set in place of a railroad spike which was set in place of a stone, marks the location of the corner.

A ¾ inch by 24 inch rebar with plastic cap stamped "MN DNR LS 17003" was set in place of the found ¾ inch diameter iron pipe and ties were taken to it as shown on the sketch of reference ties.

April 10, the DNR Division of Lands and Minerals visited the area of the corner and found the ¼ inch by 24 inch rebar with a plastic cap stamped "MN DNR LS 17003" set in 2010. The two 1975 ties to the culvert were not uncovered because their location are under the road bed and the culvert is completely filled with dirt on both ends. Ties were taken to the corner as shown on the sketch of reference ties.
