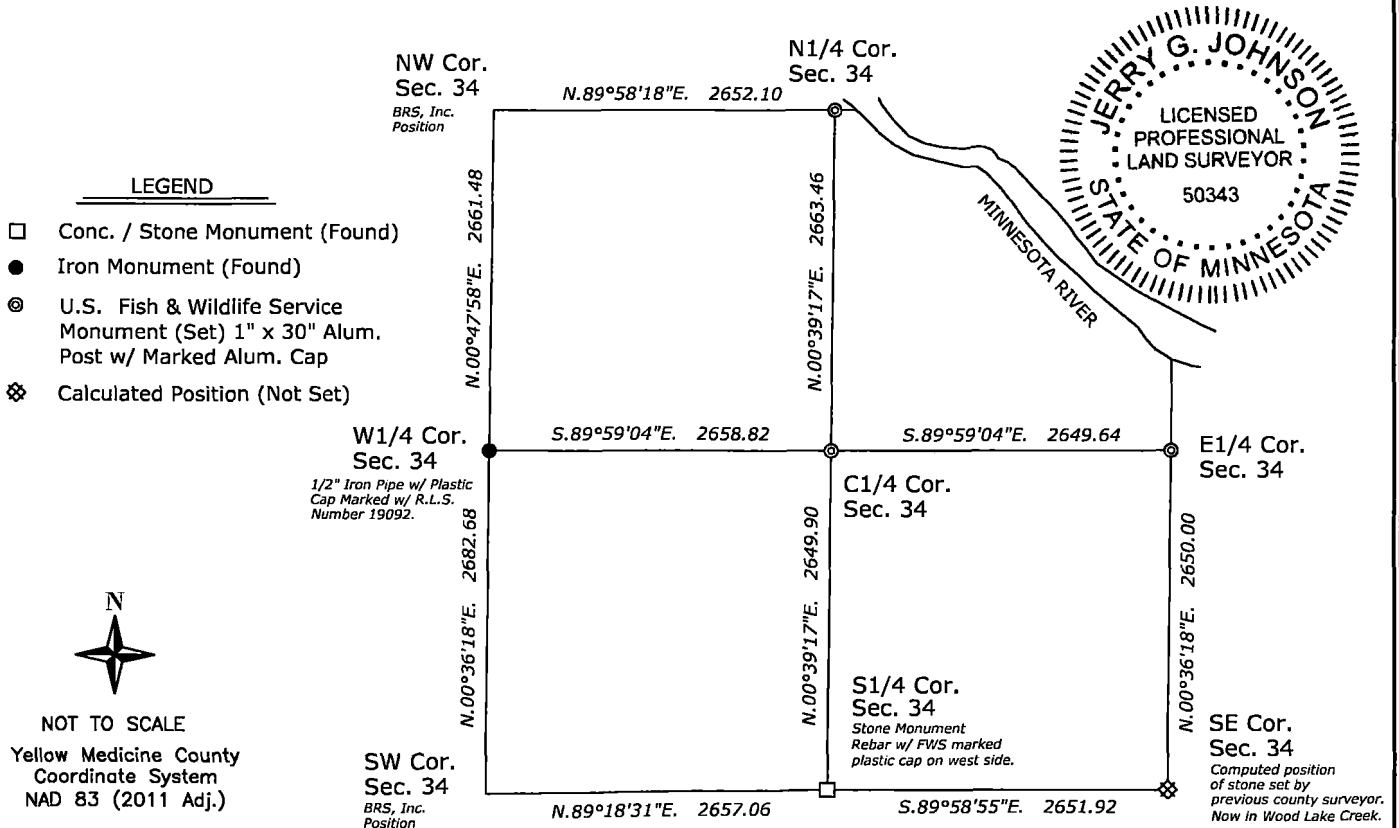

**Statement of Evidence**

**South Quarter Corner of Section 34, Township 115 North, Range 38 West, Yellow Medicine County, Minnesota.**

1857 Ehud N. Darling set quarter section post, drove charred stake, built mound of earth & dug trench per instructions.

1919 John Norgaard measured 2646' to the SW corner of section 34 and 2654' to the SE corner of section 34. This survey appears to have been done for a mortgage company and his notes are somewhat vague.

2024 Bonnema Runke Stern, Inc. preliminary drawing indicates a distance of 2655.00 feet to the SW corner of section 34 and 2654.00 to the SE corner of section 34. These measurements are based on a previous survey conducted by Duane Bonnema.

2024 FWS searched in the area of a corner fence post with fences running north, east, and west. I found a square shaped stone with an 8" spike with whisker next to it. Since the stone is in line with all existing occupation and appears to have been used in previous surveys, I am accepting it as the perpetuation of the original corner. I left the stone and spike in place and set a 5/8"x24" rebar with marked plastic cap on the west side of the stone.
